MORE RESULTS FROM NEWPORT

Important Club results are flowing in yet from the Newport marathon. Bill Markley, S.E. UConn x-country ace, finished just under 2:50 in what is only his second marathon ever. He recovered in time enough to race a mere THREE days later in a dual meet against Manchester Community College. A couple of other first-timers tasted that sweetness of going the 26 mile route. Joe Norton ran 3:14 to best better than half the field. "Tag" Tagliapietra, erroneously reported as not having finished in November's Arrowhead, actually clocked 4:43:02 to place 459th.

BANAS BRINGS BACK THE BELL

is the year that Joe cops his first major roadrace victory. On November 21st, East Hampton's "Bell Town" race became his. He cruised the short six-miler in 31:23 to bring home a handsome mounted bell. Ronnie Howard and Bill Billings placed 7th and 8th respectively. No official club race was scored but along with the top spots there were some other notable performances by Joe Norton and a fifth Strider which would have locked up a Club victory.

Jacob and Banas ran out of their gourds primarily because their Alma Mater, Johnson & Wales, fielded a team that the two Striders wanted to keep well behind them. George Maine, consistently getting in the top three of his division, nailed down the 2nd Masters award.

MIDDLETOWN 4.25 MILE, NOV. 14TH

Amby and Wayne Jacob blasted the first mile in the 4:30's as a pre-Manchester conditioner and it was all Amby from then on with a 19:54. Rob Huntington was 7th with a PR 21:30. Joe Banas, who also led The Club in the Hartford Hollday 6.6 mile with a 5th place, edged out Johnny Pirie by 4 seconds as they placed 11th and 12th among the 190 finishers. Some thought provoking stats: 10 finished within the 21 minute range; 19 within the 22nd minute; 20 within the 23rd; 28 within the 24th; 14 within the 25th; 23 within the 26th. An observation: running, i.e. speed, is becoming ever so popular.
